The spring 2023 concert season opened at the Central United Methodist Church in downtown Lansing. The following weekend we performed at Eastminster Presbyterian Church in East Lansing and at the Michigan Masonic Pathways in Alma, where, in addition to our live audience, our concert was streamed live to the rooms of the residents who were too ill or infirm to attend in person.
